

OPEN CALL OPPORTUNITY

SIX-WEEK RESIDENCY
FOR URUGUAYAN ARTISTS

In partnership with Fundación Ama Amoedo, Delfina Foundation welcomes applications from Uruguayan artists (based in or outside the country) for a six-week residency in London, taking place from 15 May to 23 June 2023.

This is the first residency for artists within the framework of FAARA Conecta, a broader initiative for artists from Argentina and Uruguay to participate in international residencies supported by Fundación Ama Amoedo. The goal is to foster dialogue between artists, expand networks, and stimulate art production in different contexts.

Delfina Foundation is a non-profit organisation dedicated to facilitating artistic exchange and developing creative practice through residencies, partnerships and public programming.

Each year, Delfina Foundation runs four three-month residency programmes: winter, spring, summer and autumn. These residency seasons are assigned either as 'open' (dedicated independent research) or '[thematic](#)' (focusing on a specific issue or idea). This residency will take place during our 'open' summer 2023 season.

Alongside gaining time and space to develop their work, Delfina Foundation's residents participate in a bespoke programme that includes:

- Guided visits to museums, galleries, non-profits, artist-run spaces and studios, as well as trips to institutions outside London.
- Opportunities to meet and engage with artists, curators, academics and researchers through organised presentations, studio visits, events and meals.
- Professional development activities including: presentations and crits, portfolio reviews, and mentoring activities.

THE SELECTED APPLICANT WILL RECEIVE:

A six-week residency at Delfina Foundation, including:

- A return economy-class flight
- Airport transfers
- Reimbursement of visa fee
- A living allowance of £30 per day
- A materials budget of up to £500
- Local travel pass
- A single bedroom with a desk at Delfina Foundation - a house which hosts up to 8 residents with shared facilities, including: bathrooms, laundry rooms, a kitchen, library and dining room.
- Opportunities to engage in the art scene in UK through structured activities and independent time
- Access to a programme of planned group activities

REQUIREMENTS:

- Uruguayan citizenship;
- Seeking an opportunity to develop their practice through research;
- Able to explain how the experience of an international residency may benefit their career development and local networks;
- Able to explain how the experience of an international residency may benefit their career development;
- Proficient in English.

Additionally, the selected practitioner will need to obtain travel insurance to cover medical emergencies, theft and other accidents.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Can duos or collectives apply?

> Generally, it is difficult for us to host residencies with collectives, given the resources and space required to host them. Our accommodation comprises of eight single rooms. We recommend that collectives or duos who wish to apply put forth one member to represent them in- residence if they are prepared to work in such a way.

Can partners, children, dependents or pets of international residents be accommodated?

> Delfina Foundation is a communal residence with limited space. Over the years we have discovered that the nature of our accommodation, as well as our intensive programmes, does not usually suit non-participants or pets/ESAs being resident on-site. If it is essential that a selected international programme participant be accompanied for part or all of the residency they will need to organise their own accommodation during this time. How can specific access support be gained?

> Delfina Foundation has always welcomed applicants from all backgrounds, including D/deaf, disabled and neurodivergent artists and others who have specific needs. We are open to discussing how our residencies can be adapted to meet the needs of selected residents. Applicants are expected to submit the following documents in English:

1. Completed application form

- Upon completion, please save the application form as a PDF file.

2. Documentation: either a portfolio or weblinks

Portfolio

- One PDF file with all images and texts
- Images must include captions or short descriptions of the project.
- There are no maximum number of images that will be accepted, but applicants are advised to only submit relevant images to reduce the size of email submissions to 4MB.
- For videos/films, please provide links in the application form. Do not send as attachments.
- Please name this document in the following format, substituting your own name:

- As an alternative to a portfolio, Delfina Foundation are happy to refer to the applicant's website.
- The website must, however, have clear descriptive information about previous projects with captions and texts. If your website is not straightforward or up-to-date, please submit a portfolio instead.
- Please list all weblinks in section 5 of the application form.

3. A CV/resume

- If your CV is not part of your portfolio, please send it separately.
- Your CV should detail recent projects, exhibitions, workshops and residencies.

- Shortlisted applicants will be invited to interview in the week commencing 6 February 2023.
- Applicants will be notified of the panel's decision the week commencing 13 February 2023.
